

<u>DIY Spooky Spider Halloween Wreath</u> Instructions found on AnnsEntitledLife.com

I am not kidding when I said this is a 15 minute craft project that nearly anyone can do. It is inexpensive, spooky, and yet whimsical at the same time.

DIY Spooky Spider Halloween Wreath Materials:

- 20" Black Wreath
- Spider Web
- Spider
- Black Garland (if your wreath did not come with an overlay built in)
- 2½" x 12 Black Wired Ribbon or Premade Bow
- Scissors
- Cutters
- Glue Gun
- Hot Glue

DIY Spooky Spider Halloween Wreath Instructions:

- Wrap black garland around wreath if you black wreath did not come with an overlay.
- Secure in place.
- Pull a few leaves away from your wreath to add depth.
- Make your bow if you did not purchase a premade one.
- When you place your bow and spider, make sure they are across from one another. The story

you are telling is the spider is crawling toward the bow.

- Stretch some spider webbing across the wreath. You "should" be able to use the leaves (skulls, spiders) that were built in (or on your garland) to hold the webbing. If that is not working out, glue a few edges in place. The more you work with your web (taffy-pulling it), the more "realistic" it will look. You do not want your web too stringy.
- Hot glue spider in place.
- Hot glue bow in place.
- Clip off a few leaves and tuck them in over the spider web to break up the white.
- Hot glue a small hanger in place if you like.
- Hang as desired.
